1. What data is processed when the website is accessed?

When you visit our website, the IP address is stored on the web server for the duration of your visit. It is not possible for us to draw conclusions about your identity through the IP address.

2. Are cookies used on the website?

Only analysis cookies are used on our websites. Detailed information on how they work, how you can delete these cookies or prevent their general storage, can be found in the Deleting cookies and do-not-track setting.

3. Do we share your data with third parties?

We do not share your data with third parties. However, we use functions of external service providers within the scope of our web presence. In these cases, however, we have defined the corresponding data protection agreements and have assured ourselves, on the basis of the technical and organizational measures, that these service providers use the necessary data security measures to protect your data from loss and unauthorized access at all times.

B. Detailed Privacy Statement

1. Scope and subject matter of the data protection declaration

The subject of this Privacy Policy is the information about what personal data we collect through our websites. As far as we link to other webpages, we have no influence or control over the linked content and the data protection regulations there. 2. Important definitions and terms

Personal data:

Processing:

Any operation or set of operations which is performed on personal data or on sets of personal data, whether or not by automated means, such as collection, recording, organization, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, retrieval, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, erasure, or destruction.

Controller:

The natural or legal person, public authority, agency, or other body which, alone or jointly with others, determines the purposes and means of the processing of personal data; where the purposes and means of such processing are determined by Union or Member State law, the controller or the specific criteria for its nomination may be provided for by Union or Member State law.

Recipient:

A natural or legal person, public authority, agency, or another body, to which the personal data are disclosed, whether a third party or not. However, public authorities which may receive personal data in the framework of a particular inquiry in accordance with Union or Member State law shall not be regarded as recipients; the processing of those data by those public authorities shall be in compliance with the applicable data protection rules according to the purposes of the processing.

Third party:

A natural or legal person, public authority, agency, or body other than the data subject, controller, processor, and persons who, under the direct authority of the controller or processor, are authorized to process personal data.

5. Logfiles

6. Plugins and embedded functions

We use functions and content from other providers (hereinafter referred to as "Third Parties"). These may include graphics and videos (hereinafter referred to as "Content").

The integration always presupposes that the third parties of this content process the IP address of the users, since they could not send the content to their browser without the IP address. The IP address is therefore required for the presentation of this content or function. We make every effort to use only those Plugins and embedded functions whose respective providers use the IP address only for the delivery of the content. Third parties may also use so-called pixel tags (invisible graphics, also known as "web beacons") for

7. Security

We maintain current technical measures to ensure data security, to protect your personal data from the dangers of data transmission and from third parties gaining knowledge. These are continuously adapted to the current state of technology and reviewed. In order to maintain the confidentiality and integrity of the data provided by you on our website, this data is transmitted via "https" and Transport Layer Security (TLS).

8. Your rights

You have the right to request confirmation from us at any time as to whether we process personal data from you and the right of information about this personal data. In addition, you have the right to correction, deletion, and restriction of data processing, as well as the right to object to the processing of personal data at any time, to revoke your consent to data processing at any time or to demand data transfer.

9. Right to object

You have the right, for reasons arising from your situation, to object at any time to the processing of any personal data relating to you based on Art. 6 para. 1 lit. e) or f) DSGVO, pursuant to Art. 21 DSGVO. We will stop processing your personal data unless we can provide compelling reasons for processing which outweigh your interests, rights, and freedom, or if the processing serves to assert, exercise or defend legal claims. C. Information on Cookies and Tracking

1. General information about cookies

A cookie is a small file that is stored in the browser of the device when the website is accessed. Cookie can be used, for example, to identify the respective terminal device or to ensure the complete and correct display of our website. Cookies also help to provide the services integrated on the website, to personalize content and to customize and analyze advertisements.

2. What cookies are there?

Depending on their function and purpose, cookies can be divided into five categories: strictly necessary cookies, performance cookies, functional cookies, and cookies for marketing purposes. Please note that not all of the cookies listed here may be used when you visit a website with a mobile device.

Absolutely necessary cookies (essential cookies):

These are cookies that are required to navigate our websites and to serve the basic functions of the website.

Performance cookies:

Performance cookies are used to improve the user experience of a website and thus the user experience. Performance cookies collect information about the way in which our websites are used, e.g., internet browsers and operating systems; Domain name of the website from which you came, number of visits, average dwell time, and pages viewed.

Functional cookies:

Functional cookies allow a website to store information already provided (such as username, login, language selection or the place where you are located) and thus offer the user improved, more personal functions.

Analysis cookies:

These cookies enable us to determine how our website is used and, for example, on the basis of which preferences and search terms are accessed.

Cookies for marketing purposes:

Marketing cookies are used to offer content that is more relevant to the user and adapted to his interests. They are also used to measure and control the effectiveness of advertising campaigns. You register whether you have visited a website or not, as well as which content has been used. This information may be shared with third parties, such as advertisers. These cookies are often linked to third-party site functionalities.
